We are always looking to find ways to make the practice more enjoyable and I would like to thank Miss Flint for organising the NSPCC's Number Day with a Rockstar Twist, taking place on **Friday, 7th February**. The day promises to be full of fun and learning as the school focuses on fluency and multiplication in support of this fantastic cause.

To celebrate the event, students are encouraged to come dressed as rockstars, tying into the school's love of TT Rockstars and making the day both educational and memorable. Whether it's leather jackets, funky wigs, or glittery costumes, everyone is invited to embrace their inner star!

Throughout the day, pupils will engage in exciting number-themed activities and challenges designed to build confidence and fluency in Maths whilst raising awareness and funds for the NSPCC. A small contribution towards this event will be greatly received.

In addition to this, we are also launching a revamped TT Rockstars competition for Years 3 to 6. The initiative, aimed at boosting multiplication skills through friendly rivalry, will see classes competing against each other for ultimate glory. The competition will run every week this term, starting on Thursday afternoons and concluding the following Thursday morning. Each day, students will dedicate five focused minutes to sharpening their times tables using the popular TT Rockstars platform. The goal? To encourage consistent practice, improve fluency, and foster a sense of teamwork and healthy competition.

How It Works

Every Thursday afternoon, the competition will kick off with scores reset, allowing each class a fresh start. Throughout the week, students' efforts during their five-minute daily practice sessions will be logged. The accumulated points for each class will determine the weekly winners, who will be announced during Friday's Assembly.

The Benefits

This revamp is about more than just winning. Daily short bursts of practice have been shown to significantly improve times table recall, an essential skill in Mathematics. Additionally, the competition helps pupils develop discipline, focus, and resilience as they aim to beat their own scores and contribute to their team's success.

Year 4 pupils have said, "I love TT Rockstars, and now it's even better because we can win against other classes! It's so exciting to see who gets the top scores."

What's at Stake?

While bragging rights are a prize in themselves, the school has hinted at additional rewards for top-performing classes, such as extra playtime or class trophies. Individual achievements will also be celebrated, with recognition for stand out players who consistently contribute to their team.

A Term to Remember

The TT Rockstars competition promises to be a term-long highlight, combining skill-building with school spirit. As the weeks progress, the question remains: which year group will reign supreme?
